This will be a great opportunity for us to get reacquainted, tell isolation stories, enjoy the warmth of our fellowship, receive updates of our organization. See you there.

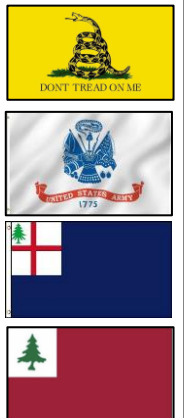
JUNE IS A MONTH TO CELEBRATE OUR FLAG

In the United States, Flag Day was celebrated on June 14. It commemorated the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution passed on June 14 1777 and stated: “Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation. In 1916 President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day.

CAN YOU IDENTIFY THESE FLAGS?



- Used by a squadron of six ships commissioned under George Washington.
- Encouraged and used by Benjamin Franklin to unite the colonists.
- Named after it’s designer for use by the Continental Marines.
- Used by the Manchester Milia during the battles of Lexington and Concord.
- Flown at the Battle of Bunker Hill to represent Americans.
- Also flown on Bunker Hill. The pine tree was a common symbol at the time representing liberty
- Represents one of our military services established on 14 June 1775.
