MEMORIAL DAY ACTIVITIES

As we've done in the past, the High-Country Chapter of MOAA takes pride in honoring and remembering local veterans who have served our nation. In particular, on Memorial Day, we seek to recognize those community members who provided the ultimate cost for their sacrificial service. In preparation for our regular Memorial Day remembrance at the Boone Mall, our chapter will place American flags on veteran gravesites at Mount Lawn Cemetery on the Saturday before Memorial Day, 25 May at 11:00 am. All gravesites marked with the decal of a saluting veteran will receive a flag. Our Boone Mall remembrance ceremony will be held on Monday, 27 May 2024 at 1100am.









Do you have a veteran loved one buried in a family cemetery, or a cemetery other than Mount Lawn Cemetery? Would you like to place a flag and decal on his or her grave-site in your family internment grounds? If so, the High Country Chapter is making flags and decals available for private family use at this year's Memorial Day activities in the Boone Mall for a donation of \$10.00. It's a great way to honor your family members with respect and pride of country.



A HISTORY OF MEMORIAL DAY



The Civil War, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries. By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers. It is unclear where exactly this tradition originated; numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. And some records show that one of the earliest Memorial Day commemorations was organized by a group of formerly enslaved people in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the war ended in 1865. Nevertheless, in 1966 the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day. Waterloo—which first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866—was chosen because it hosted an annual, community-wide event, during which businesses closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags.


